## Helium raises \$30 million Series B

<u>Termii</u>, a Nigerian communication platform-as-a-service (CPaaS) start-up, has closed \$3.65 million USD in a pre-Series A funding round led by <u>Ventures Platform</u>. Other participants in the round included Fintech Collective, Launch Africa Ventures, Nama Ventures, Aidi Ventures, Ralicap Ventures, Now Venture Partners, Vastly Valuable Ventures, NOA Capital, Assembly Investors, Probability Ventures, Adamantium Fund, MyAsia VC, Uncovered Fund, and Afropreneur Angel Group, alongside some angel investors.

Founded in 2017 by <u>Ayomide Awe</u>, <u>Idowu Atinuke</u>, and <u>Emmanuel Gbolade</u>, Termii offers a messaging solution that connects and verifies customers across channels like sms, voice, email and WhatsApp. The funding will support expansion, with a focus on Francophone Africa.



With this, Termii's total funding comes to \$5.2. million, with their first disclosed round being a \$6000 USD seed. round in 2014, prior to rebranding from social-business tech start-up Friendzdiary.

Founded in 2017 by Amr Abodriaa, <u>Mahmoud Eldefrawy</u>, <u>Moaaz Hossam</u>, and <u>Bassam</u> <u>Khallaf</u>, Rology offers an on-demand teleradiology platform that uses AI and cloud computing to deliver reports within 12 hours or in 60 minutes for emergency cases.




