
200 epic editions: thank you!

Milestones



Since we began writing this newsletter in 2019, African start-ups we're just picking up in terms of funding. We have tracked a 5x increase in funding going to African tech start-ups, with the 2022 amount coming in at over \$5 billion USD. We are proud to have continued to contribute to this ever-growing total.

This year, we have tracked 85 deals amounting to over \$1.1 billion USD raised so far. While this is a dip from the \$1.9 billion raised over 223 deals in the first half of 2022, we are pleased to see continued interest in African tech despite the economic downturn
