
Hello there,

Emata scores \$2.4 million seed round

Ugandan FinTech, <u>Emata</u>, has raised \$2.4 million USD in a seed round made up of debt and equity financing. The round featured participation from <u>African Renaissance Partners</u>, <u>Norrsken Accelerator</u>, <u>Draper Richards Kaplan Foundation</u>, and <u>Zephyr Acorn</u>, alongside some angel investors. \$1.6 million USD of the funding was debt financing, with the remaining \$800,000 USD being equity-based.

Emata was founded in 2020 by <u>Bram Willem van den Bosch</u>, <u>Davis Agaba</u>, and <u>Dario Raffaele</u>, and provides loans to empower farmers to invest in their farms and increase their revenue. The funding will go towards expanding across East Africa.

Jackfruit Finance closes seed round

<u>Jackfruit Finance</u> is a Kenyan education FinTech. They recently secured an undisclosed sum in seed funding. The round was led by <u>TCVP</u>, with participation from Optimizer Foundation, Atreyu Global, Sherpa Ventures, and Voltron Capital.

Founded in 2021 by Rob Alhadeff and Max Weiner, the start-up provides affordable financing for schools using tech and early-stage AI. The funding will support continued growth, and provide more funding to women-led businesses.

Nigerian car parts and maintenance platform, Mecho Autotech, has announced a \$2.4 million USD pre-Series A funding round. Participants in the round included Global Brain Corporation, Ventures Platform and Uncovered Fund.

The company was founded by <u>Olesegun Owoade</u> in 2021 and provides users with a platform connecting them to technicians for car repair and maintenance, as well as access to spare parts. The latest funding will support app development and growth of their spare parts value chain.
