

## Kotani Pay closes \$2 million pre-seed

Kenyan crypto FinTech, <u>Kotani Pay</u>, has recently secured \$2 million USD in a pre-seed funding round led by <u>P1 Ventures</u>. Other participants in the round include <u>Luno</u> and <u>Flori Ventures</u>.

Kotani Pay was founded in 2019 by <u>Samuel Kariuki</u>, <u>Felix Macharia</u>, and <u>Brian Kimotho</u>. The start-up enables users to remit to Africa to their local payment channels by converting their fiat to stablecoins and vice versa.



The pre-seed funding will go towards expansion to Rwanda, Senegal, Ivory Coast, Tanzania, and Nigeria. Kotani Pay previously secured <u>\$100,000 USD in grant funding</u> from the <u>UNICEF</u> <u>Venture Fund</u> in June 2021.

#### Nestcoin announces \$1.9 million funding round

Web3 start-up <u>Nestcoin</u> has raised \$1.9 million USD in a strategic funding round led by <u>Hashed</u> <u>Emergent</u>. The round also featured participation from <u>Alter Global</u>, <u>Adaverse</u>, <u>Base Ecosystem</u> <u>Fund</u>, <u>CMT Digital</u>, <u>Magic Fund</u>, and <u>4DX Ventures</u>,

The Nigeria-based company was founded in 2021 by <u>Yele Bademosi</u>, and builds, operates and invests in crypto-native products for Africans. The funding will support the scale of its product, <u>Onboard</u>, and bolstering their balance sheet.


#### Itana raises \$2 million pre-seed

Nigerian tech start-up, <u>Itana</u>, has rasied \$2 million USD in a pre-seed round led by <u>LocalGlobe</u>, <u>Amplo</u>, <u>Pronomos Capital</u>, and <u>Future Africa</u>. The funding will support product development.

Founded by <u>Luqman Edu</u>, <u>Iyinoluwa Aboyeji</u>, and <u>Coco Liu</u>, Itana (formerly Talent City) is building a "Digital Free Zone". This refers to an online jurisdiction that provides a business environment for global start-ups, to operate from Nigeria and scale across Africa. Itana aims to offer a stable policy environment, tax and capital repatriation incentives and the freedom to operate remotely for tech companies.
