Happy new year!

Welcome to the first edition of Baobab Insights in 2024. In this edition we delve into an e-mobility raise, and a couple of Egyptian deals. Also, we spotlight a Nigerian e-commerce platform.

Ampersand secures \$19.5 million investment

Rwandan e-mobility company, <u>Ampersand</u>, has recently secured \$19.5 million USD in funding led by the <u>Ecosystem Integrity Fund</u> (EIF). Other participants in the equity portion of the round included Acumen, Alphamundi, Beyond Capital Ventures, Hard Edged Hope

Fund, Societe Petrolieres du Rwanda, and <u>Total Energies</u>. The <u>Go Green Fund</u> provided \$7.5 million USD in debt financing.

Ampersand was founded in 2015 by <u>Josh Whale</u> and offers electric vehicles, battery swapping and charging stations for motorcycle taxi operators. The new funding will support increased fleet size across East Africa.



To date, we have tracked \$13.9 million USD to date in funding for Ampersand. Their last announced funding round was a \$9 million USD debt financing round in November 2021.

Egypt's Chefaa raises \$5.2 million in funding round

<u>Chefaa</u>, an Egyptian HealthTech, has raised \$5.2 million USD in a venture round. The round was co-led by <u>Newtown Partners</u> and <u>Global Brain</u>, and featured <u>GMS Capital Partners</u>, <u>M3</u>, and <u>Verod-Kepple Africa Ventures</u>.

Chefaa was founded by <u>Doaa Aref</u> and <u>Rasha Rady</u> in 2017 and provides a GPS-enabled pharmacy benefits platform to support patients to order, schedule, and refill recurring prescriptions. The latest investment will go towards accelerating the digitisation of the supply chain.



iSchool closes \$4.5 million in funding

<u>iSchool</u>, an Egytian EdTech, has closed \$4.5 million USD in a venture round led by <u>VentureWave Capital</u>. Other participants in the round included <u>OneStop Capital</u>, <u>Webit Investment Network</u>, and <u>Oraseya Capital</u>.

Founded in 2018, by Mohamed Gawish, Mustafa AbdelMoneim, Ebrahim Youssef, and Mohamed Nabil, iSchool offers live gamified classes led by coding instructors, catering to students aged 6–18. The curriculum spans AI, VR, app development, game development, and web development. The funding will go towards expansion in the MENA region.


