Egyptian AI startup secures \$4 million Series A

<u>DXWand</u>, a Cairo-based startup, has secured \$4 million USD in a Series A funding round. The round featured <u>Shorooq Partners</u>, <u>Algebra Ventures</u>, and <u>Dubai Future District Fund</u>. The funding will support R&D, as well as expansion in the MENA region.

Founded in 2018 by <u>Ahmed Mahmoud</u> and <u>Mahmoud Gomaa</u>, DXWand provides Knowledge Mining and Generative AI technology. The tech helps businesses unlock capabilities to streamline and automate their customer service conversations and unlock business insights from their knowledge.



This is the fourth disclosed funding round, following a pre-Series A round in June 2022. Including the latest round, DXWand's total disclosed funding comes to \$5.50 million USD.

Apollo Agriculture closes \$10 million debt funding deal

Kenyan AgTech, <u>Apollo Agriculture</u>, has closed a \$10 million USD debt funding deal supported by <u>Swedfund</u> and <u>ImpactConnect</u>. The debt will support expansion in the Kenyan market at scale.

Apollo Agriculture was founded in 2015 by <u>Eli Pollak</u> and <u>Benjamin Njenga</u>, and offers agronomic machine learning, remote sensing, and mobile technology to help farmers access credit, high-quality farm inputs, and customized advice.



OfferZen, a South African HRTech, has raised \$4.3 million USD in a new funding round supported by Invenfin and Al Capital. The HRTech also announced a change in leadership and launched a new model alongside the deal.

The Cape Town-based company was founded in 2015 by <u>Brett Jones</u> and <u>Philip Joubert</u>, and provides a job marketplace that helps companies hire South African developers. The investment will enable the team to improve their product offerings.
